Our History

Branches, formerly Miami Urban Ministries, was established in 1973 as the urban and social justice agency of what is now the South East District of the United Methodist Church. Up until 1999, Branches focused on grassroots organizing, advocacy and working with community members who were disadvantaged and/or experiencing social injustice. During this time, Branches focused resources in the areas of social crisis, immigration, housing, hospice care and hurricane relief, among others.

In 2000 when Mr. Brent McLaughlin moved from being a volunteer to the Executive Director, Branches embarked on developing and implementing programs that addressed the root causes of poverty and immediate and critical needs. Headquartered in a small office in Coconut Grove, Branches focused on its economic development programs by launching the ASSETS Small Business Development program and Thanksgiving meal deliveries. Branches was then introduced to a wonderful children's program being run out of the Florida City United Methodist Mission by Mrs. Kim Torres. Mrs. Torres came to Florida City as a missionary after Hurricane Andrew, now over 27 years ago, and was providing afterschool and youth development services. Mr. McLaughlin was so impressed with her program that he offered to take it in under Branches and help secure more funding to support it.

In 2004, Branches was awarded its first contract from The Children's Trust to serve 100 students at Branches Florida City. A couple years later, Branches South Miami also began serving children and youth. In 2009, Branches was selected to house and operate the United Way Center for Financial Stability at its new HQ location in North Miami, also known as Branches Lakeview, to provide high quality financial coaching services. In 2013, Branches Lakeview expanded to also serve children and youth from that surrounding neighborhood.

Today in 2022, Branches serves over 15,000 individuals per year, in particular 450+ students and their families every day at all 3 of its locations. Thanks to its many partners, Branches is able to provide truly life-changing opportunities to hardworking families and their children to help break the cycle of intergenerational poverty. Here's to many more years of changing lives!

Branches is a place where children, youth and families are valued and are given the opportunity to discover their gifts and talents and realize their God-given potential.

We are grateful for another year of service and are excited to report that in 2021 Branches hit numerous milestones, all of which reflect the enduring impact we have on people's lives. Thanks to YOUR support we have been able to achieve the following :

- Branches Florida City celebrated 27 years of continuous service.
- We provided 46 Climb thru College scholarships to Branches students valued at \$114,208.
- We served 355 students each day at our 3 Branches sites, plus 46 college students.
- We served 13,1660 individuals through financial wellness services, providing 2,198 participants with one-on-one personal financial coaching sessions.
- Our Micro-Business Team provided over 500 one-on-one business coaching sessions to 142 small businesses.
- With the help of our partners, the VITA Tax Prep coalition, Miami Tax Pros, prepared over 7,000 free filings, securing over \$12 million in refunds.
- Branches and 500+ volunteers delivered over 4,900 hot Thanksgiving meals and educational resources, and so much more...

A Grow & Climb Program Success Story:

Lourdgenie Lamothe has been attending Branches Lakeview in North Miami since her freshman year of high school. Most of our students grow up at Branches and start attending in elementary school, yet Lourdgenie's parents enrolled their three children as soon as they discovered Branches' Grow and Climb children and youth programs. Lourdgenie and her younger brother and sister began attending Branches which provided them with a safe, loving place to come after school and do their homework, complete projects, play and make friends. Most importantly, Branches helped Lourdgenie with her dream of going to college. Born to Haitian immigrant parents who did not fully understand the college application process, Lourdgenie received the guidance she needed

including SAT test prep, visiting colleges, applying to colleges, applying for FAFSA, gathering all required paperwork and more. In May of 2022, Lourdgenie will be graduating from UCF with a BA in Public Administration!

Despite the fact that Lourdgenie has always been a self-motivated student, she expresses her gratitude for all the Branches support she received, from her many mentors to the Climb through College Scholarship. Lourdgenie is the first in her family to graduate from College and we are so incredibly proud of all she has already accomplished and are committed to helping Lourdgenie every step of the way on her journey into adulthood. Corina Jimenez, founder, and CEO of Vegallia Frozen Desserts, joined Branches' Micro-Business Program during an exciting time in the life of her business. Corina's artisanally crafted, plant-based, no sugars added, non-dairy and gluten-free gelato was gaining serious attention and her sales were growing very rapidly; customers were delighted with such a creamy gelato made with conscious and fresh ingredients from fair trade and local producers.

Despite the challenges during Covid, Corina saw it as the perfect moment to give a makeover to the brand and relaunch it successfully to strengthen Vegallia's brand positioning in the market. Through Branches' micro-grant partnership with Amerant Bank, we were able to provide a grant in the amount of the labels to remove this barrier and open up new opportunities for business growth.

Corina's business is now thriving, getting attention from distributors and acquiring new markets. Branches recently purchased several dozen pints of assorted flavors from Vegallia which were served at the April 2022 VIP Gala Reception at Trish & Dan Bell's home. The gelato was served as a special treat at the event and each guest also received a delicious pint to take with them and enjoy at home.

Sharing Corina's product with new audiences also helps promote Corina's business which is a top priority of Branches. Branches is extremely proud of how far Corina has come and we know she will continue to have incredible success with her yummy gelatos!

The Achieve team offered virtual financial wellness services, providing over 4,800 virtual financial coaching sessions and over 1,280 micro-businesses with virtual business coaching services. Branches' Thanksgiving Meal Delivery

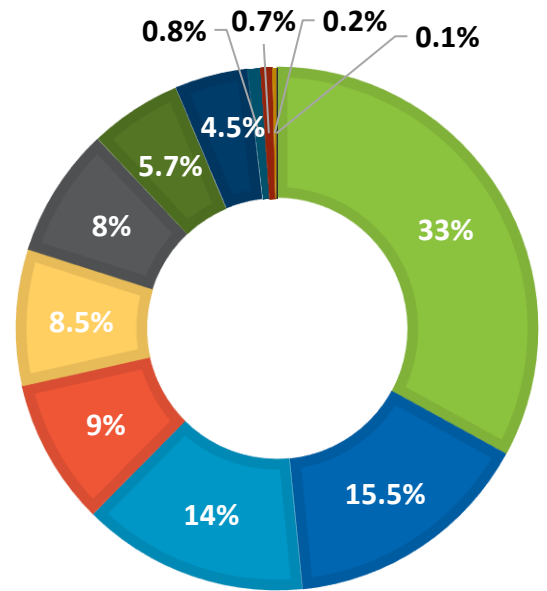

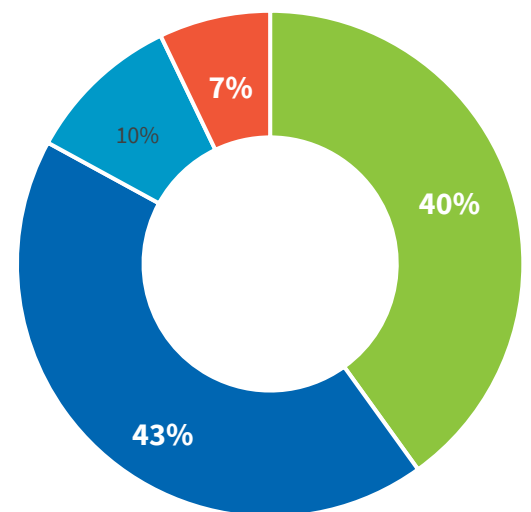
