AT&T and Compudopt Provide 100 Laptops to Branches to Help Families and Entrepreneurs Access Technology

Miami, FL (May 16, 2023) – Branches received 100 laptops thanks to AT&T and Compudopt, and distributed them to pre-registered individuals on Friday, May 12th from 4:30pm-6:30pm at Branches located at 11500 NW 12th Ave, Miami 33168. 50 laptops were for Branches' Grow & Climb families, whose children are served daily through after-school enrichment and youth development services. The other 50 laptops were for some of Branches' Micro-Business Program participants; small-business owners who will greatly benefit from a laptop which can be solely used for business purposes.

In total, more than 300 laptops were given to Miami students and families as part of AT&T's nationwide commitment to help bridge the digital divide. AT&T is working with Compudopt to provide Branches, Boys & Girls Club, and Orange Bowl with computers and other resources. The computers, funded by an AT&T donation to Compudopt, were given to Miami area residents in need to help them fully participate in our modern world.

Why is this important?

In In Miami-Dade, it's estimated that more than 74,000 K-12 students1 don't have access to the internet, computers or skills needed at home to benefit from the online world, an issue known as the digital divide.

These efforts are part of the AT&T Connected Learning initiative, created as part of our companywide, \$2 billion commitment from 2021- 2023, to help address the digital divide through internet accessibility, affordability and safe adoption.
